PHOMISES OF REFORM....HOW THEY

Mr. Editor: We have shown some of the ways in which Loco Foco politicians manage to extract the money from the public trensury, while they are endeavoring to amuse the people with with the cry of economy and reform. A few more items from the records of the self styled Democratic Councils, will be interesting at this time, inasmuch as they furnish apt illustrations of the kind of reform with which our City has been blessed for the last two years. The reports of the majority and minority of the Water Com-mittee in the case of Samuel Ogden, Chief Engineer of the Water Works, and the testimony appended thereto, which will be found in "The Appendix to the Journal of Common Council from May II to November 13, 1857," throws much light upon the engineering of an important department of the City Government, and should be read by every tax payer before he easts his

The following, among other charges, were preferred against Samuel Ogden, Chief Engineer of the Water Works:

1. Aug. 11, 1856. About 24 cart loads, say near 2 tons, oast iron was hauled away from the shop in Cherry street, to Ogden's floundry, by Hugh, McCrystal's oarts. It was not weighed at the shop, and McCrystal's sid at the time, it was not weighed on the road. Ogden told the non at the shop it was to be weighed at E. F. Wright's hay soaies, Twentieth Ward.

2. Aug. 13, 1856. Old cast iron log cylinders hauled, without being weighed, to James Mahoeney's Union Foundry, Germantown road. There were about 4 loads, say 2000 pounds each.

3. Aug. 23, 1856. S5 copper float balls for hydrant pumps, and fit for use, were hauled away, without being weighed, to Trainer's, on the wharf, above Raco street.

27 Sept. 23, 1856. Seven loads wrought iron pump bands, sh for use, hauled to Mahoney's, without being weighed, to Trainer's, on the wharf, above Raco street.

28 Dec. 1856. Solven loads wrought iron pump bands, sh for use, hauled to Mahoney's, without weighing supposed to be about six tons.

8. Dec. 1856. 300 or 1000 pounds of old brass, including several twe-inch stop cocks, that were imported by the old City, during the time of the elder Mr. Graeff, and coet \$10 or 315 a piece, were hauled to the brass foundry of David H. Siner, Randolph street, Sixteenth Ward, and no return made of the weight or sale of the same.

The following is an extract from the report of the majority of the Water Committee, to whom the charges were referred for Investigation.
