#### REPORT

OF THE

#### WATERING COMMITTEE.

THE COMMITTEE appointed to superintend the Works for supplying the City with water, in compliance with a standing resolution of the Select and Common Councils, submit the following Annual Report:

During the last year most of the important parts of the New Works at Fair Mount, mentioned in the last annual report of the committee, as being in progress and unfinished, have been completed.

The Steam Engine, upon the principles of Boulton and Watt, with the boiler, pump, and ascending main, having been finished in the month of August last, the Works were put into operation on the 7th of September following, and from that time to the present, the supply of Water for the City has been derived entirely from the New Works. The experience thus far afforded by the use of the Reservoir warrants the opinion that it is in all respects perfect, no leak or defect having at any time appeared. But with respect to some other parts of the Works the Committee regret to be obliged to state, that they believe justice has not been done to the City. Both the boiler and pump appear to be leaky and defective, but whether these deficiencies are occasioned exclusively by bad or negligent workmanship, or arise in part from other causes, they are not at present able, with certainty to determine. When the second Engine shall be put into operation so as to give full opportunity for examining without interrupting the supply of water for the City, it is hoped that the defects may be ascertained and remedied.

The Steam Engine contracted for with Oliver Evans is nearly finished; the pump attached to it is in considerable forwardness, and the contractors are of opinion that the whole will be in readiness for use, some time in the month of February ensuing.

The parts of the Works remaining to be finished are the following: The small pump at the Old Works is to be removed and fixed up for supplying the cold water cistern of the Engine; the plastering, painting, and glazing, of the Engine House are to be completed; the pump channel is to be deepened, and an iron balustrade erected upon the platform, fronting the Schuylkill. The wall of the Reservoir is also to be covered with a stone coping, and further quarrying will be needful to enlarge the wood yard, which is by much too confined.

In order to conduct the water to the City, it was originally intended, to lay down five ranges of six inch pipes, from the Reservoir to the Centre Square, but the impossibility of obtaining a sufficient quantity of suitable timber, induced the Committee, as appears by a former report to lay but four ranges of that size, and one of four inches and a half. One of

the six inch ranges has been continued down Vine Street, and united with the pipes in the upper parts of the city, and the whole have been carried to, and connected with the distributing chest at the Centre Square.

The quantity of water flowing to the city in a given time, in consequence of the alteration above stated, as well as of the friction of the pipes, and the resistance of the frequent elbows is considerably less than the quantity originally intended, and there is reason to apprehend that even more than one additional six inch pipe will be required, to give a supply equal to the consumption of the city, during the summer months. The Committee have contracted for timber, and propose to add another six inch pipe during the ensuing season. Notwithstanding the defects above mentioned it is satisfactory to observe that the populous parts of the city are much more generally and regularly supplied with water than at any former period, and the Committee do not entertain the least doubt, that the works will eventually answer every purpose expected from them.

From actual measurement the Reservoir at Fair Mount, is found to contain 3,264,126 gallons, beer measure, and from the observation of the superintendent it appears that the consumption of water in the city during the twenty-four hours, on the 6th of December last, was about 840,000 gallons, of which quantity 330,000 gallons were used during the night.

The Engine usually works about twelve hours at a time, and is found to consume five cords of oak wood, or about one hundred and six bushels of Virginia coal in thirteen hours. The stroke of the Engine is six feet, and its capacity may be estimated as sufficient to raise into the Reservoir about 2,100,000 gallons of water in twenty-four hours, though from the deficiencies before mentioned, it does not now usually perform at that rate.

The works at the Centre Square being now disused, the reason for placing the smith's shop there, has ceased, and the Committee are of opinion, that, for the purpose of distribution and repairs, for which it will be used exclusively in future, it would be convenient to have a situation nearer to the centre of the built parts of the City, with sufficient space for a shop and stable, and a yard for the deposit of tools and materials. They respectfully suggest that some of the exhausted gravel lots on High Street and Third Street from Schuylkill, might be sold and the proceeds applied to this object.

The amount actually disbursed and chargeable to the works at Fair Mount up to December 31, 1815, exclusive of the interest on the purchase of the ground, appears by the annexed list of certificates and statement marked, No. 1, to be, \$ 183,289 62

From which deduct the cost of 1,205 cords of wood, (considerable part of which is yet on hand), 592 bushels of coal, hauling &c. sundry materials for the Engine and pump, and the wages of workmen, being the general expense of carrying on the works from September 7th, to the end of the year, amounting to,

leaves the actual cost of the works at Fair Mount,

Of this sum one hundred and seventy one thousand dollars have been raised on loan at different times, during the progress of the works under the several ordinances passed for that purpose, and the residue, being two thousand seven hundred and sixty dollars and thirty-four cents, has been disbursed from the appropriation made under the ordinance passed on the 26th of October last.

The proceeds of articles sold from the Fair Mount works appear by the same statement to be, \$ 1,697 58

The estimates for completing the works at Fair Mount, including the balance upon the contract with Oliver Evans for his Engine and pump, and an additional six inch pipe of conduit from the Reservoir to the city, are contained in the annexed statement marked No. 2, and amount to \$28,855 00; to meet which it will be necessary to raise money by loan, when the several sums may be wanted. The said statement No. 2, also contains the estimates for the support of the works, for the year 1816, amounting to, \$38,975 00

The annexed statement marked No. 3, contains the account of disbursements made during the last year for the purposes of the old works amounting to \$17,390 29, together with the timber used during the same period, and the quantity yet on hand. It also contains a statement of the monies paid into the treasury by the superintendent, for old materials and other articles sold from the old works, amounting to \$1,683 72

The statement marked No. 4, contains the product of the duplicates of the water rents issued to the collectors for the eighteen months, ending on the 31st of December last. From which it appears that the actual proceeds of those rents after deducting commissions and allowances, amount to \$23,891 47, being \$969 37, more than the sum of \$22,922 10 heretofore appropriated to carry on the works for the year 1815, and leaving that surplus unappropriated. From the same statement it appears that \$654 37, have been paid into the Treasury during the year 1815, in advance upon permits issued, and \$169, for repairing over water pipes.

From the statement No. 5, annexed, it appears that on the 31st of December 1815, 2983 dwellings, 228 private baths, and 194 stalls for horses were supplied with the Schuylkill water, the rents of which amount to \$18,499 50, per annum.

The estimates for the support of the works during the year 1816, as per statement, No. 2, before mentioned amount to,
